This is a recap of the Police Productivity, Proactive and Reactive call responses. Weeks 19 and 20 of the Lake Vista Crime Prevention Detail, August 20th – September 02, 2018

<u>August 20, 2018 #37 Gull St. 10:42 p.m.</u> – Capt. V. Yetta observes the interior light on a Toyota Highlander on, no occupants inside. Check of the vehicle identified it was completely secure, no sign of entry. Owner notified.

<u>August 23, 2018 #82 Tern 8:44 p.m</u>. – Ofc. M. Hoctel assists OLDP Unit 7717 with a traffic stop at this location.

<u>August 23, 2018 #1 Lark St . 10:00 p.m</u>. – Ofc. M. Hoctel smells smoke and contacts the home owner at the residence. Owner believes smoke is coming from his roof. New Orleans Fire Department is called out. NOFD finds a rotten log next to property on fire. Extinguished with no further action needed.

<u>August 28, 2018 Heron @ R.E. Lee 7:55 p.m</u>. – Ofc. M. Hoctel intercepts a 911 Call about a suspicious (white colored) vehicle following a pedestrian in the area. Upon arrival on the scene, this suspicious vehicle is not seen and no one flags down this officer for assistance.

<u>August 29, Marconi @ R.E. Lee 3;15 p.m.</u> – Ofc. L. Gerhold assists NOPD with a vehicular accident at this location.

<u>August 29, 2018 #1 Heron 8:17 p.m.</u> – Ofc. M. Hoctel observes a Volkswagon Jetta parked with it's lights on, no occupants inside. Upon check of the vehicle, it is observed that there is a wallet and a cell phone on the dashboard in plain sight. Ofc. Hoctel makes contact with the owner, who was an 81 year male. Ofc. Hoctel assisted owner with properly locking his vehicle and retrieving his personal property.

<u>This is a recap of the Police Productivity, Proactive and Reactive call responses. Week 21 and 22 of the Lake Vista Crime Prevention Detail, September 3rd – September 16th, 2018.</u>

<u>September 5<sup>th</sup>, 2018 #46 Wren 8:45 p.m.-</u> Ofc. B. Zink responds to 911 Call, Medical Emergency in progress. Ofc. Zink meets NOPD on the scene. EMS has already made entry to the dwelling and they are assisting a white female on the bathroom floor. Subject is unresponsive, believed to have passed away while in the residence. EMS takes the female to University Hospital for final disposition.

<u>September 12, 2018 #30 Tern 7:15 p.m.</u> – Ofc. S. Meunier identifies that a car door is open on a Range Rover at this location. Ofc. Meunier makes contact with the owner who secures the vehicle. No signs of forced entry, damage or stolen property.

<u>September 12, 2018 R.E. Lee @ Marconi 8:50 p.m</u>. – Ofc. S. Meunier was dispatched to medical call of a "male laying on the ground" unresponsive. As this officer responds to the area, he finds no one on the ground and is not flagged down by anyone in the area. Upon calling the dispatcher back, the complainant had refused to identify theirself..

<u>September 13, 2018 #30 Tern 3:40 p.m.</u> – Ofc A. Agee is dispatched on a call of (2) Suspicious vehicles at the residence. Knowing that the resident had passed away at the location, he checks the license plates on both vehicles. Both vehicles come back registered to this location.

<u>September 15, 2018 #35 Swallow 8:25 p.m</u> – Capt. V. Yetta responds to multiple calls of subjects leaving bagged property in the driveways of homes in Lake Vista. This complaint is duplicated at #16 Swallow. Complainants state that "young teenagers" are leaving items in driveways. Capt. Yetta confronts the individuals and finds out that family members of a contracted vendor are delivering "Yellow Pages" in colored bags. No further assistance needed.

<u>September 16, 2018 6500 Spanish Fort 4;56 p.m</u> – Capt Yetta responds to a Fire Alarm at the Community Center. Capt. Yetta does a perimeter check of the property. No fire or smoke detected. New Orleans Fire Department responds as well. False Alarm.
