This is a recap of the Police Productivity, Proactive and Reactive call responses. Weeks 29 and 30 of the Lake Vista Crime Prevention Detail, October 29th – November 30th, 2018.

October 29, 2018 Marconi @ R.E. Lee 7:15 p.m. – Ofc. S. Meunier makes a traffic stop of a vehicle excessively speeding in the area. Ofc. Meunier checks the driver for warrants and attachments, but the driver is showing clear in Criminal History records. Traffic violation handled accordingly.

October 31, 2018 1100 Lakeshore Drive 5:49 p.m. – Capt. Yetta identifies the subjected wanted in a police department BOLO, described as a white male, possibly living out of an attached trailer. Capt. Yetta does a departmental Field Interview Card and also checks the subject for warrants and attachments. Identified subject is showing “not wanted” at this time. This subject is advised that State Property is not to be used for temporary habitation and vehicles parked over 48 hours are subject to tow and impoundment.

November 1st, 2018 #48 Wren 8:33p.m. – 911 Call concerning a Signal 103 Loud Noise Disturbance at the residence. Ofc. G. Faust responds to the area but does not hear or see any disturbance in progress. Residents at this location are interviewed as well, but are unable to substantiate what the noise was relative to their 911 call for Police Assistance.

November 5th, 2018 #3 Lark Street 9:10 p.m. – Ofc A. Zink observes a vehicle parked on a private residence with the rear hatch open. Ofc. Zink speaks to the residents who inform him the locking mechanism is broken and there is no cause for alarm.

November 6th, 2018 #41 Lark 3:33 p.m. – The resident at #41 Lark stated that an elderly female from #50 Lark was constantly beating on her door. Ofc. L. Gerhold made contact with this elderly female in question, identifying that she was unaware of her surroundings, possibly experiencing a medical emergency. Ofc. Gerhold contacted NOPD/EMS. EMS Unit 3231 arrived on scene and transported the subject to the hospital for triage and observation.

November 12, 2018 #14 Wren 11:18 p.m. – Ofc. Faust provided an escort for the resident at this location.

November 15, 2018 #105 Lark 7:27 p.m. – Ofc. Zink provided an escort for the resident at this location.

November 19, 2018 #75 Thrasher 8:26 p.m – Capt. Yetta observes an open door on a black SUV, in the driveway of this residence. Capt. Yetta makes contact with the owner who states they accidentally left the door open. No further police assistance needed.

Both officers check the residential perimeter finding a rear door ajar. As officers begin to make entry to the dwelling, they are confronted by the homeowner (positively identified) who advises the alarm was set off accidentally.

November 24, 2018 Rail @ Lakeshore 4:27 p.m. – Capt. Yetta responds to a 911 call, complainant refused to identify, stating (3) white male juveniles were skateboarding in the street and causing a disturbance. Capt. Yetta made contact with the juveniles, no criminal violations were observed. Capt. Yetta does advise the juveniles of the laws dealing with noise and general disturbances.
